


" WALK AND TALK " SERIES

The Alumni Association of SMEF's Brick School of Architecture hosted a two-day event on November 4 and 5, 2023, to connect students with alumni and notable figures in the field. Led by President Anubhav Kedia and Secretary Shubham Gandhi, the event featured panel discussions on topics such as "Masters in India," "Masters Abroad," and "Alumni Entrepreneurs," offering valuable insights and experiences. The afternoon included informal discussions and games, culminating with "Practicing with Eminent Architects" and "2ndGen Architects" panels, followed by "Out of the Box," where alumni shared their unique professional journeys. The evening concluded with "Chai with Faculty," fostering nostalgic reflections and cherished memories.

The second day began with a "Walk and Talk" session at Pataleshwar Caves with distinguished architects Ar. Sanjay Mohe, Ar. Navnath Kanade, and Ar. Girish Doshi, who shared their profound insights. After lunch, attendees enjoyed a screening of "Kanade," presented by Teepoifilms, followed by a discussion with Ar. Navnath Kanade, Ar. Poorva Keskar, and Pooja Misal. The event concluded with a felicitation ceremony, honoring the esteemed panelists, faculty, and council members, leaving attendees inspired and ready for new architectural endeavors.

1. Masters in Architecture and Design abroad



The panel had a good mix of alumni in terms of their specialization and the stage of career they are in. Fresh graduates guided students more about the admission process, scholarships, correct time to apply etc. while the more experienced ones were able to give real-world Insights, about the job market, industry trends, and the skills and qualities that are in high demand. The panel was conducted in hybrid mode- four panelists joined online from different parts of the world while one was present in person. The panel turned out to be useful in clearing most of the doubts related to postgraduate education abroad.

The panel featured a diverse mix of alumni, from fresh graduates to experienced professionals, providing insights on admissions, scholarships, job market trends, and essential skills. Conducted in hybrid mode with online and in-person participation, the panel effectively addressed many doubts about postgraduate education abroad.

2. Masters in Architecture and Design in India



The panel discussion featuring alumni focused on master's courses in architecture and allied fields in India, aimed at B.Arch students, highlighted several key points. Alumni emphasized the importance of specialization, suggesting a few courses including urban planning & design, conservation, sustainable architecture, and construction management to mention a few as promising fields. They also discussed the increasing relevance of technology in architecture, recommending programs that integrate advanced software and digital tools. The panelists shared insights on selecting institutions with strong industry connections and experienced faculty. They also spoke about pros and cons of a masters degree in India and abroad. Additionally, they stressed the value of internships and practical experience. Overall, the discussion provided a comprehensive guide for B.Arch students to navigate their postgraduate options, aligning their interests with emerging trends in the industry.

Alumni highlighted the increasing relevance of technology in architecture and recommended programs with strong industry connections. They also discussed the pros and cons of pursuing a master's degree in India versus abroad, stressing the value of internships and practical experience.

3. Alumni Entrepreneurs



A panel discussion on entrepreneurship post-graduation in architecture for B.Arch students featured insights from alumni Harshal Mutha and Ajinky Kashid. Harshal, a 2018 graduate, co-founded THINK, a multidisciplinary design firm, in 2019, successfully completing over 70 diverse interior projects. Additionally, he emphasized the importance of practical experience, networking, and giving back through teaching and community service.

Ajinky Kashid, part of a trio of Brick alumni, discussed the entrepreneurial journey of their young architecture firm, which operates across multiple cities. He stressed the significance of innovation and collaboration in building a successful practice. Both panelists encouraged students to embrace challenges, leverage their networks, and continuously seek opportunities for growth and learning in the entrepreneurial landscape of architecture.

Alumni shared insights on entrepreneurship in architecture during a panel discussion for B.Arch students. Harshal, co-founder of THINK, emphasized the importance of practical experience, collaboration, and community service, while Ajinky discussed innovation and collaboration in building a successful practice. 

Tanisha Agarwal transitioned from architecture to patisserie, earning a diploma from ENSP in France. After gaining experience in Parisian bakeries and restaurants, she returned to India and founded Monté Baking and Co, specializing in French-inspired desserts using high-quality ingredients.




Figure 1: A snapshots of the event






2. Brick conversation from the alumni for their works on redesign of quarrentine facilities







The webinar received a good response with the students and faculty appreciating the effort for the 1st webinar.


Majority of the questions were addressed through the QnA and live audience questions.


