8. Shastrapujan in Navaratri


October 23th 2023

Ayudha puja or Shastra puja is the worship of weapons that takes place on the ninth day of the Navaratri festival. The weapons are brought for use with the blessing of the goddess on the tenth day of Vijayadasam. Ayudha puja is a pan-Indian phenomenon, although it has traditionally been limited to those closely associated with and responsible for the use of weapons, such as royal families and schools of martial arts such as kalaripayattu. Today, gun worship is mainly practiced by the police, security personnel and military personnel. Most units of the Indian Army have a long tradition of Ayudha puja.. The profession of architecture and planning is much dependent on use of knowledge and tools. The institute paid due respect of these two by worshiping Goddess Sarasvati and tools in Navaratri. The event was organized by the admin department of the institute.

Introduction

"Plogging" is a concept devised in the contemporary age as a fun way of combining fitness with cleanliness. Our cities are turning into dumping grounds with excessive littering as a rampant nuisance. Innovative initiatives like *Plogathons* (Cleanliness drive marathons) help motivate citizens to partake in the responsibility of keeping their cities clean.

The drive covered 134 roads in the city covering various heritage sites and a total of 45 parks in the city. The activity sensitized the students of imbibing cleaning as a ritual and towards innovative ways of approaching waste management and cleanliness.



The following topic was about how students might meet future issues, to which the speakers responded that exposure to worldwide projects, not living in a bubble of design, and having numerous job possibilities were the answers.

Following the eye-opening response, the next interesting question posed by Mayuresh sir was whether there is a loss of context, to which Ar. Niraj Doshi replied about how less aware the people are about the simple facts about the site and context, which was followed by a question on what all preparation one should go through for an internship. To this topic, all of the presenters offer valuable advice on how students should be interested and ask questions, be knowledgeable about current technology and software, and have a collaborative approach.

The panel discussion concluded with the final question from Pooja Misal ma'am on how they could improve their teaching techniques, which was answered by Ar.Niraj Doshi, said that more than academic learning, there should be a focus on practical learning, and he also suggested that students do part-time jobs in addition to academic learning and that there should be a clear understanding of the basics, along with which students should learn different things.

After the engaging panel discussion, there was an introduction to travel and research grants by Vaidehi Lavand followed by the presentation of previous winners. After the introduction of the travel and research grant, the unveiling of the college magazine - Design Infinite, Synthesis reveal by Ketaki ma'am, and Brick publication house's book Aparantha took place. Ar. Sharduli gave a brief overview of the book. The session then furthered into the announcement of the winners of the research and travel grant. This year's research grant was won by Hrishita Grandhi and Aishwariya Prasad and the travel grant was by Tejas Patil , Komal Kumbar, and Mayur Pande.

Finally, scholarships and their recipients were announced. Saeem Khan received the V.K architects' laptop, Akshata Rathi and Anuradha Yadav received the Manoj Sahodeo Scholarship, and Omkar Godse received the Dr.S. M Kulkarni Scholarship.



With 15 years of rich experience across 15 million square feet of designed spaces, her work stands for design and technical excellence. Ar. Pritika believes in architecture being a powerful problem solving tool, a potent medium that can stand for change and impact.

Brief of the Workshop:

On the occasion of International Women's Day- a day to celebrate the feminine -Architect Pritika Manjrekar had shared her insights on how to lead an organization with tools built on the principle of yin-yang leadership.

International Women's Day has existed in various forms across the world for more than 100 years. Initiated in the early 20th century, it has since evolved across a range of different labor and social justice movements, to eventually becoming an official event in 1975 recognized by the United Nations, and thereafter celebrated annually.

According to the UN's International Women's Day Organization, this is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity. Every year there is a new theme that is associated with the goals for the upcoming year. For 2023, the theme has been set as 'embracing equity'.

This year's IWD campaign speaks about encouraging important conversations on various pertinent questions relating to gender parity like- Why equal opportunities aren't enough and Why "equal" isn't always fair. The basis of these questions lie in reassessing the term- equality and replacing it with- equity and parity, and we start noticing that true inclusion begins only then.







He has studied in IDC, IIT Bombay for M.Des. Course in product design. While studying, he assisted Prof. Gogate from IIT Aerospace Dept. in Designing and developing the cockpit and pilot sitting arrangement for the IIT Bombay experimental Aircraft. He has designed many lightweight long-span structures and now he is working on 6 creek bridges for MSRTC for the Western Coastal Highway stretch from Mumbai to Jaigad. He is also enthusiastically involved in academics.

The Western Naval Command of the Indian Navy had exhibited the world's largest national flag at Mumbai's Naval Dockyard, overlooking the iconic Gateway of India, on Navy Day, as part of 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' on Saturday.The flag measured 225 feet in length and 150 feet in width and weighed about 1400 kgs and is made of khadi and was manufactured in 49 days with 70 Khadi artisans to prepare this flag. This monumental structure is a tensile structure and It supports the Indian flag which is almost 34000 sq. Ft. This structure was designed and executed in a record time of one month by Third Wave Design.





Attended by students and faculty of the institute


